Bill Henderson lives in Forres, Moray, and has what can only be described as a diverse and eclectic range of musical skills.

He regularly leads or co-leads open-access choirs and workshops including the Forres Big Choir, Sounds Deep Men's Choir and Bukhari Georgian choir. As an instrumentalist, Bill was trained on classical piano, he runs scratch bands using music from the East European circle dance repertoire and has performed jazz and folk based work in a variety of settings ranging from wedding jazz gigs in posh hotels to folk festivals in muddy fields.

He's been a community choir leader for 25+ years and his repertoire of "inspirational songs from around the world" is extensive, including Pop and Rock, African, Georgian, Welsh, World Music, Taizé, traditional, contemporary and much more. Running regular groups and workshops is his greatest joy, and his teaching is enthusiastic and great fun.

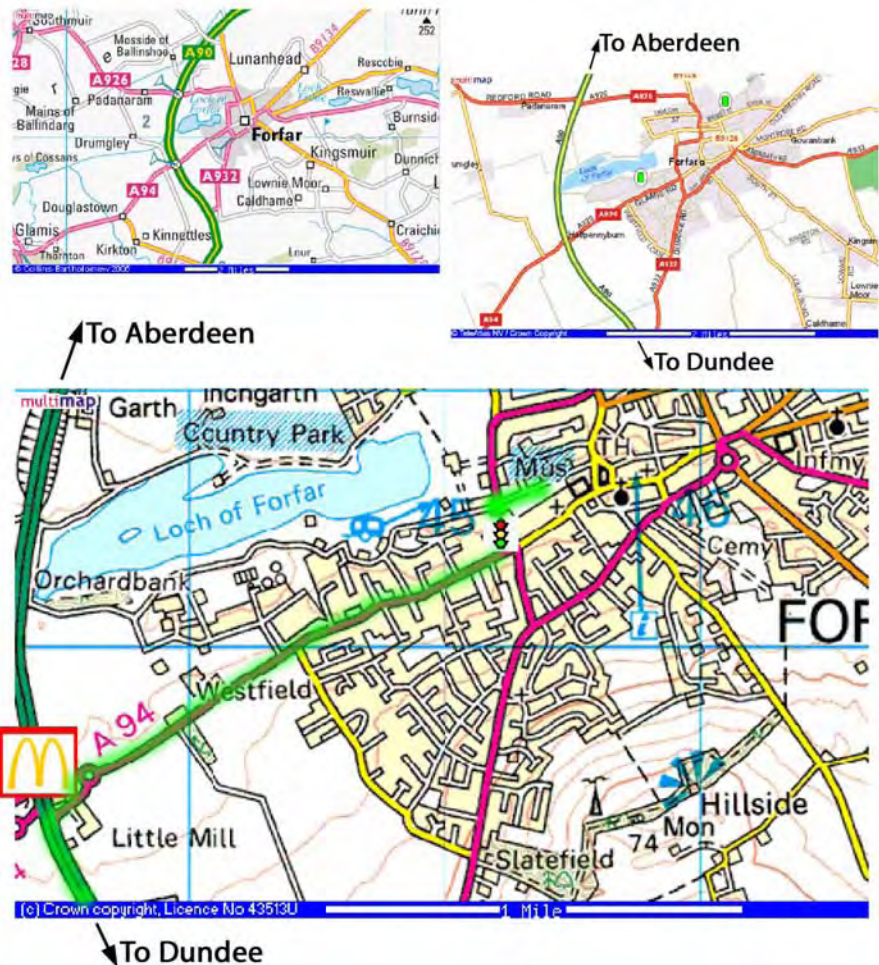

From the A90 Dundee
To Aberdeen dual-
carriageway, take the
A929 junction to Forfar.
There is a McDonalds
'restaurant' at this
junction.

Follow Glamis Road
straight in to the town
until you reach the
traffic lights at the end
of West High Street.

St. Margaret's Church is straight ahead over these lights, on the left, between the bank and the post office. However, to park your car, turn left at the traffic lights and the first right, signposted for the Myre Car Park. This is a free car park and you can leave your car all day. From the car park, a small lane / steps leads up the side of the Guide Hall to St. Margaret's Church. At the top of the steps, opposite the postal depot, the entrance to the church hall is the first gate on your right.
