Corrina Hewat decided to dedicate her life to music in 1994. She was brought up surrounded by folk music, first in Edinburgh then in the Black Isle, and, in addition to her harmony knowledge, singing ability and technical skill on the harp, has completed a degree in jazz. She is best known as part of the groups Chantan, Shine and Bachue, and is co-founder and director of the Unusual Suspects, while also contributing to over thirty CD releases since she began performing. She is also a skilled and innovative composer and arranger, having written many large-scale commissions. She tours the world performing and teaching workshops and master classes to pass on the tradition and is a core tutor for both the RSAMD in Glasgow and the Traditional Music degree at Newcastle University. Recent projects include a trio with Karine Polwart and Annie Grace (the 'harmony goddesses'), a duo with Kathryn Tickell, and another solo album; due for release in May 2008. She is a great singer, brilliant musician and first-class teacher.
