Gordeanna McCulloch is recognised as one of the finest singers of Scottish traditional songs of her generation. She was encouraged to sing at home in Glasgow from an early age, but her involvement in traditional song began at Rutherglen Academy where she was influenced by Norman Buchan. As a teenager, Ewan MacColl invited her to London to join his seminar weekends with the Singers Club, and she joined the prestigious Scots group, Clutha, aged 19. With them, she made recordings for the Argo and Topic labels and toured extensively in Britain and Europe. Her style represents a link with the older generation of ballad singers such as Jeannie Robertson and Belle Stewart, and today she is one of the most respected singers and teachers of traditional song in Scotland. More recently, she has sung with the harmony group Palaver, as a duo with Chris Miles, and occasionally with Eurydice, the women's choir she helped form and led for 17 years. Since January 2006, Gordeanna has devoted more time to performing and leading workshops, and has recently accepted a part-time post teaching traditional song for the Royal Scottish Academy.
